Small and Large plastic Syringe (*No needles)	Some ER Cash
BPS Free Water Bottle (filled)	One-Size-Fits-All Temporary Muzzle
Blunt Nose Scissors	Extra Leashes and or "D" Leash
Ticked-Off Tick Remover	Cold Packs
CPR Shield	Antiseptic Towelettes
Tweezers	3% Hydrogen Peroxide (4 FL Oz)
Digital Thermometer	Saline Solution Eye Wash (4 FL Oz)
1" White Adhesive Roll	Iodine Swab Sticks
Non-Stick Pads for burns (6)	Triple Antibiotic Ointment (*Neosporin)
Gauze Squares (10)	1% Hydrocortisone Cream
Gauze Rolls (4)	Tri-Buffered Aspirin Tablets
Flex-Wrap Self-Adhering Elastic Bandage	Diphen Tablets/Antihistamine (*Benadryl)
Triangular Bandage for slings/splints or bandannas	Diotame Tablets/Antacid (*Tums)
Emergency Blanket	Simethicone (*Gas-X)
Portable Food and Water Bowl	Antibacterial Soap (*Dial bar soap)
Emergency Meal and Water	Chlorexidine Cleanser (*Hibiclens)
Doggie Walk Bags	Water Based Protectant (*K-Y Jelly)
Pets Toy	Styptic Powder
Emergency ID Tag
